A Guide to Discussing Your Concerns with Your Primary Care Provider

When you're worried that your have an eating disorder, figuring out how to get help can be very overwhelming. Primary care providers (family doctors and nurse practitioners) play an important role in addressing eating disorder concerns, which can span diagnosing, referring to specialized eating disorder programs, and providing regular medical supervision. It's recommended that you arrange to be assessed by your primary care provider as one of the first steps in getting help.

You may find this discussion guide useful to have on hand when you visit your primary care provider.

Describing changes in your body, behaviours, and functioning will help your primary care provider understand why you're worried that you are experiencing an eating disorder.
